Savers Alliance

This is a program initiated by United Way of Lane County and maintained by NEDCO & Goodwill. The program empowers participants who cannot get a bank account to develop a positive relationship with a credit union through an approved training process administered by NEDCO & Goodwill. The participating credit unions are Oregon Community Credit Union, Pacific Cascade Federal Credit Union and SELCO. Participants have access to six training modules through NEDCO & Goodwill. As they complete the modules, they gain access to more credit union products as preferred members. There is no charge for this program and fees are waived for one year.

IDA

Individual Development Accounts

Individual Development Accounts were created by the Oregon legislature to encourage low-income residents of Oregon to save money, become financially capable and learn to develop assets. IDAs are matched savings accounts where the amount a participant saves is matched by the state on a 3/1 or 5/1 basis to accomplish defined asset development projects. The maximum savings that can be matched for each IDA project is \$3,000 and the maximum time a participant has to complete each project is three years. There are ten categories of projects and the maximum match an individual is allowed to receive for all IDA project completed is \$20,000. Eligibility is based on income and accumulated asset limits. The following organizations manage this program and provide support for the designated projects:

LIHEAP is a federal program that provides financial assistance to low-income households for home heating and energy bills. The program is seasonal and winter services are available as early as funding allows. LIHEAP payments can be applied to Electricity, Gas, Wood, Pellets and Propane. Waiting lists open at all LIHEAP agencies on the first working day of November. Households can call (541-682-3835) on the first working day of each month to see if the list has reopened. LIHEAP provides monthly energy subsidies upon completion of an intake based on need. First-come, first-served.

EWEB CUSTOMER CARE (ECC) – Program funded by EWEB's Electric and Water departments, EWEB customers, and the City of Eugene. Qualified EWEB customers may receive one standard ECC payment of \$200 per customer household per program year. ECC funds can be applied to a customer account even if the customer has a credit balance or is on the budget billing payment plan. ECC is first come/first served by appointment.

Provides energy conservation education and a kit of energy saving devices to income qualified EWEB Customers. ECCP also includes bill assistance, financial management education and referrals to weatherization and other community resources. Participants have a 1 hour appointment with an Energy Advocate. After completing the appointment, a \$50 payment is applied to the participant's EWEB account. Households are enrolled in the program for 1 year. Over the course of a year participant households can earn up to another \$300 towards their utility bill by doing a variety of activities.
